# Editorial

Bilhaṇa, the renowned 11<sup>th</sup>-century Kashmiri poet, calls the ocean 'ratnākara' meaning 'a mine or treasure of jewels'. It is said, 'अद्यापि रत्नाकर एव सिन्धुः' meaning, the ocean continues to be a treasure house of jewels, despite its jewels being taken away year after year. Similarly, mahātmās remain unfathomable and unaffected though hundreds and thousands of people benefit from them over the years. They possess an inexhaustible treasure of knowledge. CIF was founded by one such mahātmā, the visionary Pūjya Gurudev Swami Chinmayananda, in 1989. We at CIF, are blessed by his grace that ensures a ceaseless paramparā of Swāmins, Brahmācārins and householders motivated to disseminate the ancient wisdom.

The vision of CIF is to be a bridge between the past and the present, the East and the West, science and spirituality, and the pundit and the public. To actualise this vision, CIF regularly conducts Home Study Courses (HSC), webinars and on-site camps. Besides, CIF and CIF Shodha Sansthan publish books on various subjects related to Sanskrit and Indic studies.

This year, Adi Sankara Nilayam experienced an enormous footfall during Pūjya Guruji Swami Tejomayananda's camp in November 2023 and again during Chinmaya Sankaram celebrations held from 8–12 May 2024. This year, being the 108th Jayanti of Gurudev, numerous events were held at CIF and Chinmaya Vishwa Vidyapeeth's new campus in Onakkoor.

Swami Sharadananda Sarasvati facilitated a Puja Vidhanam Course on two levels, Shakti Upasana Camp during Navarātri, Saundarya Lahari Camp and a Gita Saram Camp. Academic talks on temple architecture during the Puja Vidhanam courses threw light on the scientific flavour of the ritual aspect of worship. An Advaita Vedanta Immersive on the Brahmasūtras was convened by Swami Advayananda.



International Yoga Day was jointly celebrated by CIF, CIFSS, and Krishnamacarya Yoga Mandiram (KYM), Chennai, by organising a national conference on 'Yoga as Embedded in Indian Culture'. It was inaugurated by Hon'ble Sri Arif Mohammad Khan, the Governor of Kerala. The inauguration alone drew over 150 participants.

Spoken Sanskrit classes, a Sanskrit Fest with 500 student participants, a national conference on 'Kerala's Contribution to Vedanta' tradition sponsored by ICPR, New Delhi, a camp by Prof. V. N. Jha on Indian Materialism, an onsite workshop on Lexicography, and an online course on manuscriptology by CIFSS, were some of the other academic events. Webinars by Prof. Gauri Mahulikar on Dvandvadevatā Sūktas (Dual Divinities) and Pañcamahābhūta Sūktas from the Ṛgveda, and Sanskrit Launchpad were well received by Indian and overseas participants. The Home Study Courses Department launched nine new courses and as many as 38 webinars between June 2023 and May 2024. This helped connect many new people with CIF.

An online Hindu Spiritual Care Certificate programme of 24 credits, recognised by the Association of Professional Chaplains (APC) in the USA, was launched by CIF. The programme was coordinated by Smt. Vilasini Balkrishnan and had 65 seekers enrolled. Br. Ved Chaitanya was the main faculty from CIF, along with Prof. Ramesh Pattni (Professor Emeritus, CVV), Madhu Sharma and others.

CIF conceptualised numerous book projects in the past year. A few have been published while the rest are in the pipeline. The CIF publication team remains continuously occupied with the printing and reprinting of books to cater to the demand. The aim is also to have an e-version of every printed book.

Apart from the various activities, festivals like Onam, Janmashtami, Ganesha Chaturthi, Diwali, Lakshmi Narayana Puja, Maha Shivaratri and so on were celebrated at CIF with games, havana, fun and food validating the Sanskrit saying, 'उत्सवप्रियो हि मनुष्यः'. The campus truly reverberated with activities and festivities, for which we are grateful to the gods and gurus.

# Academic Camps

## 3-day National Conference on Yoga as an Embodied Culture of Bharata

Date: 30 June to 2 July 2023

Mode: Hybrid – Residential and Online

No. of Participants: 60

Chinmaya International Foundation (CIF), CIF Shodha Sansthan (CIFSS) and Krishnamacharya Yoga Mandiram (KYM) collaborated to conduct a 3-day National Conference on Yoga as an Embodied Culture of Bharata at CIF. The goal was to show how Indian culture and ethos subsumed yoga in all its facets spanning all the religious and socio-cultural activities. It also aimed to break the general misconception that yoga is simply about āsanās and prāṇāyāma practised by certain classes of society.

The inauguration ceremony was graced by the Hon'ble Governor of Kerala, Sri Arif Mohammed Khan. Following a grand welcome, he was given a guided tour of the illom, the ancient maternal birth home of Śrī Ādi Śaṅkarācārya, by Swami Sharadananda Sarasvati. The Hon'ble Governor performed āratī in the birth room of Śrī Ādi Śaṅkarācārya and was honoured with token gifts.

The other dignitaries present at the inaugural function were Swami Vivikatananda Saraswati (Head, Chinmaya Mission, Kerala), Adv. Anoop Jacob (MLA from Piravom), Prof. Shrinivasa Varakhedi (Vice Chancellor, Central Sanskrit University, New Delhi), Dr Latha Satish (Research Head, KYM), Prof. Ajay Kapoor (Vice Chancellor, Chinmaya Vishwa Vidyapeeth), Prof. K. T. Madhavan (Chairman, CIFSS), and Prof. Gauri Mahulikar (Academic Director, CIF). Attended by over 150 people, the inaugural event was widely covered by the print and online media. The event was streamed live on CIF's YouTube channel. The conference had six invited speakers who covered various topics related to yoga. The keynote address by Dr Nagaraj Paturi, Director of Indic Academy, unravelled the theme of the conference 'Yoga as an Embodied Culture of Bharata', emphasising the importance of recognition of yoga in all its facets in our daily lives. Dr Latha Satish, Head of research, KYM, elaborated upon 'Yoga—The Psychology of Mindfulness', highlighting the inherent characteristics of mindfulness as popularly understood and its correlation in yogic practices, the factors that affect the process of being mindful and the impact of lack of mindfulness.

The talk on 'Yoga and Nāṭya—Meeting Points' delivered by Smt. Nrithya Jagannathan, Director, KYM, explored the core principles of yoga as detailed in the Yogasūtras, mapping them to corresponding concepts in the Nāṭyaśāstra and the Abhinavabhāratī with specific emphasis given to nāṭyotpatti, the siddhis and the concept of rasotpatti and saḥṛdayatvam.

Dr Veena Londhe, Professor, Department of Sanskrit, Mumbai University, in her presentation on 'Yoga as a Cultural String of India', referred to the Bhagavad-gītā and Yogasūtras while speaking on sense control, cultivation of focussed attention, samatva, sādharmaṇa-dharma which is yama-niyama of Patañjali yoga, Law of Karma, and Bhakti Yoga. With a focus on these topics, Dr Londhe showed how yoga acts as a cultural bond across India.



Prof. Krishna Sharma, Chairman, Department of Human Consciousness and Yogic Sciences, Mangalore University, in his talk on Yoga as Traditional Therapy expounded on the yogic concept that diseases originate in 'cittavikṣepa' and controlling which diseases can be controlled. But such control needs a regulated lifestyle involving food, sleep, work and so on.

Through her presentation on 'Nāma-saṅkīrtanam—The Yoga of Devotional Singing', Smt. Devasena Bhavanani showed how singing kīrtanas and bhajans makes the mind calm and peaceful leading to yoga. She sang a few bhajans and kīrtanas creating an environment of calmness which her talk emphasised. Smt. Devasena Bhavanani is the General Secretary and Head of the Department of Sanskrit and Dance at ICYER, Ananda Ashram, Pondicherry.

Along with the lectures of guest speakers, there were 37 paper presentations. The presenters were from diverse backgrounds—academic and research scholars, yoga experts, artists of music, dance, martial arts, and so on—from various regions of India. Over 60% of the paper presenters were below the age of 35 years which showed that the youth of India are striving towards upholding traditional and cultural roots and taking them forward into the next decade.

The chief guest at the valedictory function was Dr A. Radhakrishnan, President of Patanjali Yoga Training and Research Centre, Thrissur, who emphasised the role of yoga in everyone's life. He talked about a proper diet and sādhanā for the overall well-being of the body, mind and soul.

The conference was attended by over 60 people both online and offline. The feedback from the participants showed that the conference achieved its stated objectives of instilling confidence and a sense of pride in yoga and culture among the young participants. Conferences such as these bring people from different fields onto a common platform to show that although their fields of work are diverse, the commonality of yoga and culture binds them all together. The paper presentations will shortly be published as a proceeding of the conference.





# Spoken Sanskrit Evening Classes

No. of Participants: 40

To promote the usage and vocabulary of Devabhāṣā Sanskrit among the residents of the CIF campus, evening classes on Spoken Sanskrit were conducted under the guidance of Dr P. K. Sankaranarayanan from Samskrita Bharati, for 8 days at CIF.

The special programme was inaugurated by Swami Sharadananda and Prof. Gauri Mahulikar. The 40 participants included the staff of CIF and CIFSS, along with residents from nearby areas and children.

Dr P. N. Sudarsanan (Director, CIFSS) welcomed the participants, while Dr G. Rajashekhara Reddy (Deputy Director, CIFSS) delivered the vote of thanks.

Dr P. K. Sankaranarayanan conducted the sessions enthusiastically, prompting and guiding everyone in a fun way to converse in Sanskrit. Gradually, all the participants were effortlessly using Sanskrit words in their daily conversations and enjoying doing so!

The training sessions concluded with a valedictory ceremony presided over by Swami Advayananda (President, CIF) and Dr P. N. Sudarsanan. The participants shared their experiences and demonstrated their insights through recitations and performances. Swami Advayananda emphasised the many benefits of knowing Sanskrit and encouraged everyone to continue conversing in Sanskrit to perfect their skills.





# Sanskrit Fest 2023

Mode: Residential

No. of Participants: 500

The CIF Shodha Sansthan organised a Sanskrit Fest where a plethora of competitive events were hosted and every event was well-attended, bringing together 500 students from 30 schools in Kerala over two days. The inaugural event was graced by Swami Advayananda. Dr P. N. Sudarshanan welcomed the participants, and Dr V. R. Manoj (Deputy Director CIFSS) proposed the vote of thanks.

The panel of judges consisted of eminent personalities from the field of Sanskrit including Dr C. N. Ratnam (Retd. Professor, Maharaja's College, Ernakulam), Prof. Jyotsana Gangadharan (Associate Professor, Government Sanskrit College, Tripunithura), Dr Sarita Maheswaran (Associate Professor, Government Sanskrit College, Tripunithura), Dr Vinod Kumar K. P. (Assistant Professor, Department of Sahitya, Government Sanskrit College, Tripunithura) and Sri Anil Narayanan (Assistant Professor, Chinmaya Vishwa Vidyapeeth).

The participants competed in various events in Sanskrit including Bhagavad-gītā chanting, poem recitation, essay writing, elocution, storytelling, akṣara-śloka (poetic quatrains) and group song. The festival celebrated Sanskrit language and culture, encouraging the continued use of the language and its appreciation among the youth.



On the second day, the winners and participants were honoured at a grand prize distribution ceremony. Swami Sharadananda Sarasvati delivered the benedictory address and Prof. Gauri Mahulikar presided over the event as the Chief Guest. Dr L. Sampath Kumar (Head, School of Linguistics and Literature Studies, CVV) presented the certificates and trophies to the winners. Bhavans Varuna Vidyalyaya, Ernakulam, won the championship, and Chinmaya Vidyalyaya, Kolazhy, was the runner-up.

## *Conference on Kerala's Contribution to Vedanta*

**Date:** 2 to 4 February 2024

**Mode:** Hybrid—Residential and Online

**No. of participants:** 111

CIF and CVV jointly conducted a 3-day Hybrid National Conference on 'Kerala's Contribution to Vedanta' at Adi Sankara Nilayam, Veliyanad, with financial support from the Indian Council of Philosophical Research (ICPR) where various eminent academicians presented papers on the contribution of prominent spiritual leaders from Kerala towards Vedānta.

72 participants attended the conference on-site (residential) while 39 participants attended it online. Presentations were made in multiple languages—30 in English, 7 in Sanskrit and 3 in Malayalam. There were 33 on-site presentations and 7 online presentations. Among the presenters, 9 were invited speakers, 19 were faculty/research scholars and 12 were students.

The conference had a three-tier structure: invited speakers, faculty/research scholars and students. The invited speakers were allotted 45 minutes each, while the faculty/research scholars were allotted 15 minutes each and the students 10 minutes each.

The presenters and attendees on campus were from Kerala, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh, Maharashtra, Delhi, and Uttar Pradesh and the online presenters were from Andhra Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Singapore and Sweden. The conference was jointly hosted by Prof. Gauri Mahulikar and Dr Sunitha Grandhee (Dean, Lifelong Learning and Wellness, and Director of the Centre for Applied Indian Knowledge Systems at CVV), representing CIF and CVV respectively. Prof. Sachidananda Mishra (ICPR) was present on-site to deliver the keynote address during the inauguration.

The conference was inaugurated in a spiritual setting—the lighting of lamps accompanied by the chanting of hymns by Swami Adityananda of Chinmaya Mission, Mandya, Swami Swatmananda of Chinmaya Mission, Mumbai, Prof. Sachidananda Mishra, Member Secretary of ICPR, Prof. Sunitha Grandhee from CVV and Prof. Gauri Mahulikar. Many distinguished scholars, sannyāsins, ācāryas and academic luminaries were also present.

Prof. Gauri Mahulikar welcomed the gathering and thanked Prof. Sachidananda Mishra whose efforts made the conference possible. In his inaugural address, Swami Swatmananda reminded the audience that Bharata was and still is, a knowledge power. Prof. Sachidananda Mishra, who is a renowned scholar, academician and the recipient of the Maharshi Badrayan Vyas Samman, (Presidential award) expressed his pleasure on being at Adi Sankara Nilayam, the birth home of Śrī Ādi Śaṅkara and the seat of CIF. While acknowledging Kerala's contribution to Vedānta, he reminded the audience that Vedānta is not just Advaita alone but also includes other schools of thought by sages and eminent ācāryas of other Vedic traditions.



At the valedictory function, two student participants reflected on their experience at the conference and the transformation it had kindled in them. In his valedictory address, Swami Narasimhananda, Ramakrishna Mission Sevashrama, Kozhikode, encouraged the audience to consider what should be the follow-up to the conference and Vedānta studies in general.

Prof. Gauri Mahulikar thanked all those who had contributed directly and indirectly to the conference and the participants for sharing their wisdom, knowledge and expertise through the respective topics they covered as a conference paper or through their speeches. Prof. Mahulikar expressed gratitude to ICPR for supporting the conference. She offered humble praṇāms to Swami Narasimhananda for participating in the entire conference sharing his Vedāntic knowledge and offering his guidance to one and all who were fortunate to have his satsaṅg.



## A Workshop on Indian Materialism

Date: 17 to 24 February 2024

Mode: Residential

No. of Participants: 50

A workshop on Indian materialism, the darśana of the materialists called Cārvākas, was conducted by Prof. V. N. Jha at Adi Sankara Nilayam.

Prof. Jha is the former director of the Centre for Advanced Studies in Sanskrit (CASS), Pune. Currently, he presides over Rishi Rina Trust (RRT), Pune, a non-profit educational organisation. The Trust disseminates lessons and teachings on a broad range of Indian darśanas.

The Indian darśanas (often translated as schools of philosophy) are broadly divided into āstika and nāstika—darśanas that recognise the authority of the Vedas and those that do not, respectively.

There are traditionally considered to be six āstika and three nāstika darśanas. Rishi Rina Trust has already offered sessions that have covered the basics of all āstika darśanas. This workshop on the darśana of the Cārvākas is the first in a series of presentations on the nāstika darśanas. Workshops on the darśana of the Bauddhas and the Jainas are to follow.

Close to 50 students of all ages and backgrounds and from all over India, including a group of students from Manipal University, Karnataka, attended the workshop. The participants enjoyed the pleasant and green environs of the CIF campus and the serenity of Adi Sankara Nilayam.

The camp was inaugurated by Prof. Jha. Professor from BHU Dr Rajiv Ranjan Sinha and Prof. Gauri Mahulikar were also present. Sri Ananta Basudev Nanda, Curator of the Manuscripts Section at CIFSS, conducted the opening proceedings.

Prof. Jha taught from a portion of a text on the Cārvākas preserved in a work called the Sarva-darśana-saṅgraha authored by Sri Madhusudana Saraswati. He elucidated how the Cārvākas engaged proponents of various other darśanas, like those of the Nyāya-darśana. There were stimulating rounds of exchanges between the darśanas based on the validity of a means of knowing other than perception. The Cārvākas advanced ingenious arguments that attempted to undermine the grounds for other means of knowing.

As Prof. Jha stressed, the text demonstrated the spirit of vibrant, penetrating, and often humorous modes of intellectual conversation that flourished between the various darśanas in pursuit of the search for the Truth. He contrasted this with the acrimonious and senseless debates that dominate much of modern-day discourse, especially in public media. The students found time towards the end of the course duration to stage a cultural evening. Poetry, songs and a tabla rendition marked the rich evening.

A convocation ceremony on the final day of the workshop witnessed valedictory addresses by Prof. Gauri Mahulikar and Prof. Jha. Prof. Mahulikar expressed hope that CIF would be able to host many more such workshops in the future. The students, thrilled by the intellectual stimulation of the workshop, returned home with new knowledge and wisdom to reflect upon.





# Svādhyāya and Sāadhanā Camps

## *Puja Vidhanam Course (Preliminary Level)*

Date: 12 August to 10 September 2023

Mode: Residential

Facilitators: Swami Sharadananda Sarasvati and Br. Mukund Chaitanya

Number of Participants: 35

The Puja Vidhanam Course (Preliminary Level) is a flagship programme of CIF conducted under the expert guidance and tutelage of Swami Sharadananda Sarasvati at the sacred and serene Adi Sankara Nilayam.

The course was inaugurated by Prof. Sundareswaran (Professor of Sanskrit, University of Calicut). The chanting of basic sūktas preparation and performance of pūjās and havanas, the philosophy behind the rituals and so on are some of the topics covered in the course. The Gāyatrī Havana every Sunday provided an added practical and blissful experience for the participants. By the end of the course, the participants happily committed to the pracāra of the knowledge which they had gained.

The course concluded with a valedictory address by Swami Advayananda.





# Shakti Upasana

Date: 15 to 24 October 2023

Mode: Residential

Facilitator: Swami Sharadananda Sarasvati

Over nine sacred days, the participants of the Shakti Upasana Camp, who had travelled from different parts of the world, experienced the grace of the Devī in all her avatāras with reverential offerings of pūjās and havanas led by Swami Sharadananda Sarasvati.

Each day was a deeply spiritual experience, marked by a series of rituals and practices devoted to the different forms of the Devī starting with Śailaputrī, Brahmācārīnī, Candraghaṇḍā, Kūṣmāṇḍā, Skandamātā, Kātyāyanī, the fierce Kālarātrī, Mahāgaurī on Aṣṭamī, and finally the gracious Siddhidātrī on the ninth day.

The day would begin with the Devī being awakened at 6 a.m. with the Uthāna-ārati and the singing of the Lalitā-suprabhātam. The mid-morning activities included Gaṇapati Havana, Pañcāyatana-pūjā, Laghu Caṇḍikā-havana, and Mahālakṣmī pūjā, invoking the divine blessings. Swami Sharadananda's discourses on Śrī Ādi Śaṅkara's 'Mantramāṭṛkā-puṣpamālā-stavam' enriched the spiritual understanding, followed by the chanting of the Lalitā-sahasranāmam.

Special pūjās like Navakanyā-pūjā and Sumaṅgalī-pūjā on Aṣṭamī and the grand Mahā Caṇḍikā-havana on Navamī further deepened the spiritual experience. The daily rājopacāra of vādyam, gītam, and nṛtyam offered to the Devī Bhagavatī by the students of CVV was delightful. The entire atmosphere was rendered divine, with these daily rituals easing the participants into serene peace.

The camp concluded on Vijayadaśamī, that is 24 October 2023, with a Sarasvatī-pūjā. On the occasion, 15 children were initiated into study with a Vidyārambham ceremony.





# Vedanta Unveiled

Text: *Bhagavad-gītā* Chapter 15, *Puruṣavidhabrahmaṇa* of *Bṛhadāraṇyaka-upaniṣad* and *Svarūpānusandhānam*

No. of participants: 220

The Vedanta Unveiled Camp unfolded over seven enlightening days serving as a transformative odyssey for seekers diving deep into the realms of spiritual wisdom and self-realisation at Adi Sankara Nilayam. The camp opened with inaugural blessings and soul-nourishing discourses by Pūjya Guruji Swami Tejomayananda centring on the profound teachings from chapter 15 of the *Bhagavad-gītā*.

The participants embarked on a journey of insight, delving into the depths of knowledge with teachings from learned teachers such as Swamini Vimalananda (Chinmaya Mission, Coimbatore) on the intricacies of *Puruṣavidhabrahmaṇa*, a section from the *Bṛhadāraṇyaka-upaniṣad*, and Swami Advayananda shedding light on *Svarūpānusandhānam*, a composition of Śrī Ādi Śaṅkarācārya. Engaging in group discussions and the daily Guru Pāduka-pūjā further enriched the exploration of śraddhā, bhakti and jñāna.

220 participants from various corners of the globe converged for this spiritual immersion. The vibrant ambience of Adi Sankara Nilayam reached its zenith during these seven days with the palpable presence of Śrī Śaṅkara permeating the sacred surroundings of his birth home, offering a profound experience to all attendees. The camp drew to a close on 29 November 2023, leaving participants enriched, enlightened, and inspired on their spiritual journeys.





# Gita Saram (Malayalam)

Text: Bhagavad-gītā

No. of participants: 29

Mother Gītā resides in the heart of Pūjya Gurudev Swami Chinmayananda. She keeps flowing to the world through His devotees. The 18th chapter of the *Bhagavad-gītā* which is considered the consolidation of all the 18 chapters was the prime focus of study and discussion during the five-day residential camp held at Adi Sankara Nilayam.

Swami Sharadananda Sarasvati expounded in-depth on the 18th chapter of the *Bhagavad-gītā* in Malayalam. In the evenings the participants soaked in Bhakti through satsaṅg with Br. Sudheer Chaitanya on *Navadhā Bhakti Sūtras*.

Śravaṇam during the sessions, mananam during the group discussions and nididhyāsanam when on their own, evoked devotion, knowledge and purity in action in all the seekers. Adi Sankara Nilayam embraced the participants with the affection of a mother.





# Laghu Vakya Vritti

Date: 20 to 22 December 2023

Mode: Residential

Facilitator: Br. Ved Chaitanya

Text: Laghu-vākya-vṛtti

No. of Participants: 48

Br. Ved Chaitanya explained the text *Laghu-vākya-vṛtti* in his simple inimitable style. The word 'laghu' stands for short or condensed. The verses in this text focus on the practice of the mahāvākya '*aham brahmāsmi*'. The early morning meditation sessions led by Br. Ved supported the study of the text. The informal post-dinner Q&A sessions in the courtyard of the Adi Sankara Nilayam helped the participants dive deeper into the text.

## Hindu Spiritual Care Programme (HSC)

CIF has a new offering, mainly for the Hindu diaspora in the form of a training programme for Hindu Spiritual Care Providers (Hindu Chaplains) to serve the Hindu community around the world. Chaplains of all religions are in great demand in the West, and provide spiritual services in secular environments, such as in universities, hospitals, hospices, government, and the military. Whereas Christians, Jews, Muslims, and even Buddhists are well represented by their chaplains, there have been relatively few Hindu Chaplains globally to date.

The vision and inspiration for this programme come entirely from Pūjya Gurudev. With the blessings and guidance of Pūjya Swami Swaroopananda and the support of Swami Advayananda and Br. Ved Chaitanya, CIF has developed an online Certificate in Hindu Spiritual Care (CHSC) programme of 24 graduate credits. Smt. Vilasini Balakrishnan, MS, LCPC, oversees the CHSC as its programme director. The courses are taught over three semesters of part-time study by Hindu academics, chaplains, and swamins including Dr Ramesh Pattni, Dr Madhu Sharma, and Br. Ved Chaitanya. The courses are recognised by the Association of Professional Chaplains (APC) in the US toward becoming a Board-Certified Chaplain.

Currently, 65 students are enrolled in the CHSC. The students are mainly from North America, and some from India. Also, while most are from Chinmaya Mission, several are from other Hindu sampradāyas. Eleven students completed the 24-credit programme in June 2024, and another 50 students are in process. A new batch will begin in January 2025. ### Ravi Iyer, the first Hindu Chaplain in Houston

CIF held the first graduation ceremony for the Certificate in Hindu Spiritual Care programme on 5 June 2024. The programme celebrated the milestone with the graduation of its inaugural cohort of 11 students.

The ceremony was held virtually during the final session of the Rites, Rituals, and Vedanta course taught by Br. Ved Chaitanya. The graduates were congratulated for their hard work in this first-of-its-kind comprehensive training programme in Hindu Spiritual Care (Chaplaincy). The graduates from across the US and Canada included Ashlesh Dani and Bina Dani (Poughkeepsie, NY), Hema Ramanathan (Plymouth-Canton, MI), Indira Palekar (Cleveland), Meenakshi Venkataramani (Boston), Pradeep Solanki (Toronto), Rakhi Khanna (Chicago), Ravi Iyer (Houston), Sangamesh Konaraddi (Frederick, MD), Sonali Dave (Dallas), and Sowmya Kesari (Acton, MA).



Students undertook coursework in Hindu spiritual traditions, the Bhagavad-gītā, Vedānta philosophy, Indian psychology, Hindu rites and rituals and sādhanās, ethical principles and competencies of chaplaincy, and communication skills. They concluded their studies with chaplaincy practicums at healthcare and other facilities. Guest speaker Swami Shantananda, President of Chinmaya Mission West, praised the graduates for their commitment to serving communities through spiritual caregiving.

“By blending ancient wisdom with modern healthcare needs, you are ambassadors lighting the way for Hindu spiritual care to be integrated into diverse settings,” he stated.

## Vedanta Vijnana Course

On 5 May 2024, Pūjya Guruji Swami Tejomayananda inaugurated the Vedanta Vijnana Course at Sandeepany Sadhanalaya, Mumbai. The course is facilitated by Swami Advayananda, the Resident Acharya of the Vedānta Course. This enriching 88-week course, jointly organised by CIF, Chinmaya Mission Mumbai, and Tara Cultural Trust, is designed to explore the essence of Vedānta through the texts Ātmabodha, Bhagavad-gītā chapters 2 and 15, the Muṇḍaka-upaniṣad, concluding with Bhagavad-gītā chapter 18.



The online course is designed such that participants can enrol at any time and begin from the first session of any of the texts. Digital Participation Certificates are awarded to those who complete each text. With sessions every Sunday, this course is open to all. It is available both onsite at Sandeepany Sadhanalaya from 10:30 to 11:30 a.m. and online via Zoom for all the registered participants.

Swami Advayananda introduced the basics of Vedānta to over 100 students at Sandeepany Sadhanalaya. He guided the students in meditation techniques and emphasised the importance of meditation along with detailed steps as part of the session. After the class, the students were encouraged to participate in group discussions to reflect on the teachings and clear their doubts. The first set of 19 sessions on Ātmabodha concluded on 29 September 2024.

The recorded discourses were streamed via Zoom on Sunday evening for over 200 online students. For the benefit of the online students, fortnightly Q&A sessions were held as part of this course by Brni. Taarini Chaitanya. After each session, the students can go through the optional self-assessment questionnaires made available on their dashboard. Thus, the course is comprehensive in all aspects.

During the concluding session on Ātmabodha, Swami Advayananda clarified the doubts of the participants on-site. In an expression of their gratitude, the students offered flowers at Pūjya Gurudev's altar while chanting the Chinmaya Aṣṭottara-śatanāmāvalī. After offering their guru-dakṣiṇā, each student received a prasāda-pustikā from Swami Advayananda.

## Ancient Indian Mathematics

### Vedic Mathrix 2024

18 to 22 April 2024

CIF, in association with the School of Vedic Maths, completed the 15th annual residential camp 'Vedic Mathrix' in April 2024.

Of the 58 participants, five were teachers and the rest were mainly high school students. The faculty, Sri Vinay Nair, founder and trainer at the School of Vedic Mathematics, along with his co-teacher, Sri S. Aparajith, a teacher from Agastya Gurukulam, Bengaluru, took the students through various topics like binary mathematics, algorithms, permutations and combinations, and so on, using poetry and music from Chandaśśāstra, and other texts from the Indian Knowledge Systems (IKS). The participants were in awe when they saw a smooth blend of art, mathematics, and computer science. Some of the topics discussed included aspects from modern-day number theory, which was discussed as early as 2300 years ago in India.

Apart from the six hours of daily maths sessions, the students also enjoyed outdoor games, informal discussions, village walks, spending time in the library and evening bhajans. Post dinner during



informal discussions, students would come up with topics like 'an ideal school' or 'finding our true calling as a career pursuit'.

The participants said that they thoroughly enjoyed the camp and were looking forward to the camp next year as well.

# Adi Sankara Jayanti 2024

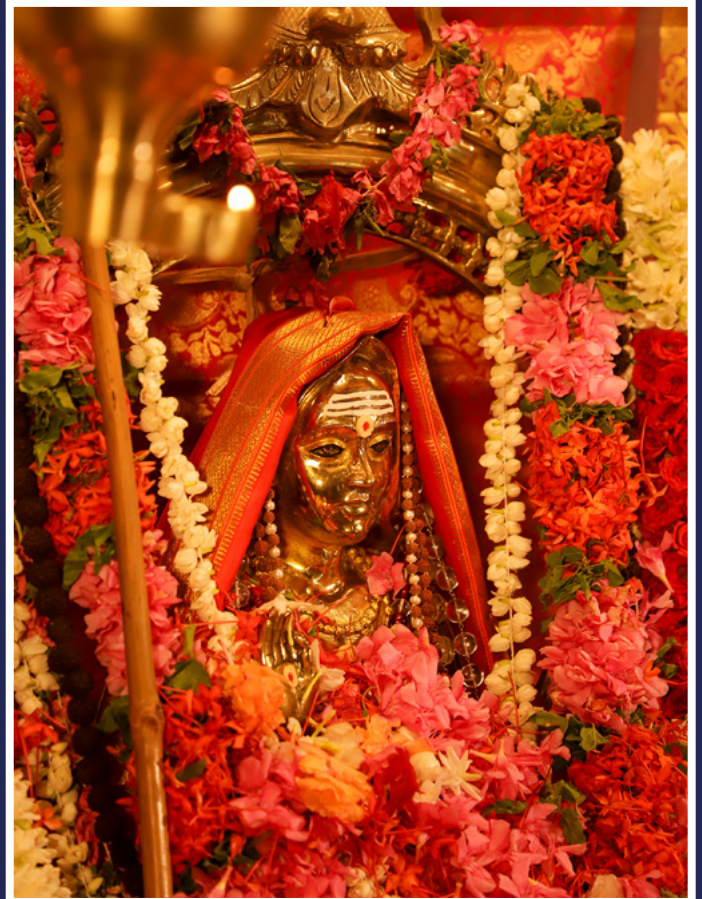
## 12 May 2024

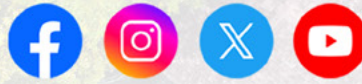
